If the 102-year-old year old Totty Cup is the *Champions League* of the Don & Dearne, then the Barlow-Salmons is the *Europa League*.

The Totty Cup now has a 'bronze medal' final - the Gordon Swann Cup.

Our *UEFA Conference League* equivalent is the Brian Hyde Cup. Brian, along with Gordon were our regular referees for decades.

Remarkably **Wath Victoria**'s only Totty Cup win was in the inaugural competition in 1923 (cover photo).

St. Johns have won it three times - most recently in 1992.

It's a Dearne derby in the Barlow-Salmons with regular finalists **Lacewood** facing **Goldthorpe** who have only recently rejoined our competitions - thanks to Jack Steers.

The Gordon Swann final features the same teams as in 2024 - **Carrfield & Wath OL&SJ**. The Brian Hyde final has two schools with a successful history, but it has been a while since they reached finals - **Hill** (2012) & **Kilnhurst** (2016).





Bob Lamb Our Very Own Silversmith



In the last few years, **Bob Lamb** has restored trophies to their former glory that are now in use for Don & Dearne School football competitions.

Bob started as an apprentice aged 15 when there were 10,000 silversmiths in Sheffield - now there are just three left in the city.

Bob's other work has included the World Snooker Championship Trophy, the Calcutta Cup, the FA Cup and the European Cup. This month Bob has retired but not before completing two more restorations for us.

The **Karen Walker Shield** will be a secondary competition for the girls which will be first awarded in May.



The **West Shield** has been in a Brampton Ellis stock cupboard for the last 50 years or so. Bob has expertly rejuvinated the shield. This was competed for by intermediate boys in the Don & Dearne - roughly Year 8s. Again, we hope to kick-start the West Shield with a Wath Academy v Dearne Academy match this year.

The Don & Dearne Girls Cup

Dearne Carrfield's Andy Morton is the driving force behind the girls football in the Don & Dearne.

The ITV cameras came to Goldthorpe for the inaugural finals as it was ahead of the Women's Euros 2022.

Mexborough St Johns won the final on penalties against Brampton Ellis.

In 2023, **Wath C of E** were the winners, followed by **Brampton Ellis** last season (pictured below).

The 2025 finals are scheduled for Thursday 22nd May.



The Karen Walker Shield

The girls will have a second-tier competition for the first time this year.

Goldthorpe's **Karen Walker** can boast more England caps than *Gary Lineker* and has scored more goals for her country than *Michael Owen*.

Karen was the first person to score a hat-trick in every round of an FA Cup season (in 1992).

Karen lives away from South Yorkshire but is aware of the new cup: 'Having something named after you is the thing of dreams.'

Wath Wanderers

Wath Wanderers were a feeder club to **Wolverhampton Wanderers** in the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s.

Mark Crook (pictured) ran this football factory which had **108** professionals passing through.

A blue plaque unveiling is planned for Mark Crook for **Friday 30th May 2025**, with a charity book on the back of it.



Here's a snippet from the draft introduction written by Ashley Ball :

"Mark Crook's players went on to face Puskas and Pele. They were in World Cup winning squads and picked up international caps. Former Wath Wanderers scored winning goals in FA Cup finals and they lifted the UEFA Cup. One went for a British record transfer, have astonishing goalscoring records and in Flowers' and Swinbourne's case sit in the hall of fame for the club he predominantly provided for."
